 - Design and implement a new teacher support structure for an oncoming first year math teacher next year.


ELA Goal:

Maintain and/or increase student proficiency levels in ELA, including subgroups


- Action Steps:

Masada's Comprehensive Needs Assessment (CNA) Results



Challenging school experiences (sampled) from stakeholder survey

- I feel elementary students are in school longer than necessary for state requirements. Friday school is unnecessary. With a few small changes in scheduling, the required hours could be met without school on Fridays.
- Teaches need A raise in their income.
- The class sizes are getting large
- Too much homework & pushing School Blue Ribbons while children get left behind & shamed.
- It's challenging to not have a regular substitute at the Jr High level. The parapros have to drop student interventions regularly to cover and that is hard for kids and teachers that need the support.
- I feel that if the student does not have an IEP, they do not get the help they need during the day.
- The school struggles to engage high achieving students.
- I would really like to see some teaching happening in PE for the junior high kids. My kids tell me
 they don't do much except during tournaments and then the ninth graders are the ones who
 teach them how to play not the teacher. Some of the ninth graders are real jerks to the younger
 kids about it and don't know how to teach basketball and they shouldn't have to.
- I wish there was more support available for homework after school. Also, I've never been a fan
 of signing homework slips. It would be nice of these could be eliminated and a better system of
 accountability implemented.
- Bullying tends to be in the rise. Cyber bullying by students is on the rise and needs to be addressed.
- My students spend too much time doing homework in the evenings. It takes them at least an hour if not more and they are only 9 years old.
