What is a Title I Program?

- ▶ Title I is one part of the Every Student Succeed Act (ESSA). It provides funds to schools to help ensure that all children meet challenging state academic standards. Any school that receives Title I funds becomes a Title I school.
- In addition to supporting students, Title I funds also support teachers and staff by providing professional learning opportunities to improve instruction.
- The Arizona Department of Education manages the Title I program for Arizona's schools and districts. Information regarding the ESSA in Arizona for charter schools can be found here:

What is a Title I Schoolwide Program?

- Masada implements a Schoolwide model of Title I.
 - A Title I Schoolwide program is designed to upgrade the entire educational program through a well-rounded environment to ensure all students especially those considered most academically at-risk are able to attain academic proficiency. The Schoolwide model lets schools align their funding to serve the entire school, staff, and parents.

What does the Title I Program look like at Masada?

- At Masada, our Title I program helps ensure that structures are in place to support at-risk students and monitor student learning, including:
 - Ongoing, systemic, and data driven professional development for all teachers.
 - Scheduled and embedded collaborative sessions for teachers to discuss strategies for student support.
 - Daily and/or weekly progress monitoring.
 - In-classroom professionals to provide 1 to 1 and/or small group interventions.
 - After school homework clubs and individualized interventions.

What does the Title I Program look like at Masada?

- Title I funds support improved student academic achievement by:
 - Providing funding for salaries for in-classroom aides who monitor student progress and give interventions.
 - Providing funding for professional development opportunities for teachers and staff.
 - Providing funds for extra support programs such as summer school.

What interventions do students receive?

- Decisions about student interventions and supports are made collaboratively.
- Masada is able to provide students with individual and/or small group support/interventions within the classroom, including but not limited to:
 - Daily or weekly progress monitoring
 - After school homework clubs and academic help
 - Individualized support for monthly reading goals (AR support)
 - Academic and/or behavioral coaching
 - Specific strategies for learning content and skills
 - Goal tracking

How does Masada track student progress?

- Masada believes in using student data to make programmatic decisions.
- Student data may come from:
 - Daily assignments.
 - Regular benchmark data from universal screeners and classroom assessments.
 - Teacher designed assessments aligned to the standards being taught.
 - Personal reflections from the students themselves.
 - State testing results.
- If students are not making academic growth, teams meet to shift the program or intervention.

How does Masada engage parents?

- In Title I schools, parents have the right to become involved in the school programs including: supporting students in homework responsibilities, attending student presentations and classroom parent shares, attending student SEP's, participating in student achievement recognition activities, maintaining membership on PRISM Committee, and/or connection with Governing Board through parent representatives.
- Parents also have the right to attend a variety of meetings with school staff to provide suggestions about the Title I program, viz. annual parent meetings, parent education opportunities, specific planning meetings, etc. We use parent surveys and/or committees for obtaining input for development of the Title I Plan.

Masada cares about student success

- We believe that parental involvement facilitates student success.
- We encourage parents to be engaged in their child's school experience and actively reach out to teachers with questions and/or concerns.
- We appreciate the calls we receive from parents...
- We value you, our parents, and the trust you extend to us when you enroll your student in Masada.
- Because our program IS NOT textbook based, we appreciate parent commitment to regular student attendance.
